Dear Fellow Parishioners,

After Roger announced his retirement last week, the Vestry wanted to send out a note to reassure the parish of the ongoing life of St. Andrew's and its wellbeing, and briefly outline the process St. Andrew's will undertake in a search for a new Rector. The ECCT (Diocese) has a many tiered process for this and Roger has reassured us that the process really works well. Our most important operative word is "patience." Not always an easy trait to follow particularly since Roger has faithfully guided and blessed us for 34 years. He did note that after looking over the church directory, most of the congregation has only known Roger as our Rector, therefore we really are going to need patience and understanding as we follow the ECCT's lead in our search.

Roger's last Sunday is September 29th and on Sunday October 13th the Reverend Canon Lee Ann Tolzmann, ECCT Office of Mission Leadership, will come to St. Andrew's to preach and make a presentation to the Parish. This will be a very important time for us to learn the process that the ECCT has in place for making the transition of a retiring Rector to a new Rector.

The Vestry will be contracting with clergy for Sunday and weekday services and other pastoral care until a PIC (Priest in Charge) has been appointed, usually 2-3 months. After the PIC has been appointed, a Transition Team in consultation with the Bishop and Vestry will be appointed to move forward with our search for a new Rector. Questions, emails, and phone calls are most welcomed and appreciated. Please feel free to reach out to Chris Rekhov or myself or any member of the Vestry. If we don't know the answer, we will find out.

It's so difficult not to think about "I" in Roger's announcement, but as a loving Parish we must rejoice in Roger's plans for his future and look to all the opportunities for St. Andrew's future. This will be a challenging, inspirational and exciting time for us. I know St. Andrew's is a strong parish who can rise to this occasion. Take the opportunity to enjoy our remaining time with Roger and always have him and the future of St. Andrew's in your prayers.

The ten bells of St. Joseph's Chapel at Kent School are hung for **change ringing**, a form of bell ringing first popularized in England during the 17th century. Ringers memorize striking patterns and practice putting them together into compositions.

- Guild practices are held the second and fourth Sundays of the month,¹ from 3-5 pm.
- Guild members also regularly travel to towers throughout the Northeast,² and occasionally overseas.³
- All levels of experience and ability are welcome! New ringers can join any regular practice.
