### From Father Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's,

I hope you are doing well and are planning to vote next Tuesday (or have already voted via an absentee ballot). Voting is an important vehicle for expressing our faith and doing the work of Jesus in this world.

This morning, I heard a spot on the radio that haunted me. Connecticut Public runs a short feature called "Bird Note" each weekday morning, and this morning's episode was a recording of a pair of adult owls emancipating, as it were, their several-month-old fledgling. They had been feeding the juvenile in the nest for several months, and the time had come for it to go out and hunt its own food.

We heard the fledgling in the nest let out repeated shrill cries—screams, almost —of hunger ... of fear ... maybe even of abandonment. The parent owls, who were together in another tree, a way off from the nest, both hooted back, in response, each time, but they didn't go to the fledgling, which needed to learn to make its own way in the world. This went on, the ornithologist-narrator reported, for *hours*. She found the whole exchange fascinating. I, however, found it heartbreaking; I all but cried. The mature owls were doing the right thing, of course, but I couldn't help sympathizing with the juvenile: hungry ... alone ... maybe a little angry ... and probably *a lot* anxious. There are countless ways we might allegorize or theologize this tiny slice of nature. But what it brought to me, later, over a cup of tea, was the mysterious constancy of Christ. Like the mama and papa owl with their fledgling, Jesus creates us, feeds us, nurtures us, protects us, equips us and sustains us. But, at some point, comes the time for us to feed our own faith, too: to take a risk ... make a commitment ... be more thankful ... repent of a bad habit ... judge less ... rekindle a dying relationship ... give more generously ... pray more deeply ... volunteer more meaningfully. And when this time comes, Jesus doesn't abandon us—doesn't fly away; but He also doesn't hover. He allows us the time and the space to ponder, to try, to fail and to try again; and all the while, He prays constantly for us.

Perhaps, I came to realize, the true poignancy of today's "Bird Note" lay not in the archness and terror of the young fledgling's cries, but in the fact that the parent owls never left ... or failed to hoot, in reply.

Take good care, and may God continue to bless the work of the Kingdom you are doing.



You have been hearing and reading about Stewardship and have been asked to pledge to sustain and grow St Andrew's. Many of you have responded in the generous and kind-hearted way of our parish.

If you have not yet pledged, please pledge as generously as you comfortably can to support St Andrew's and to grow our community of Fellowship. # St Andrew's Wants *You*: From the Nominating Committee



It is, once again, the season to think about who would like to serve St Andrew's by standing for election at our annual meeting in early February. At that meeting, we will elect three new vestry members; two delegates to the diocesan annual convention; and two alternates to convention. Vestry members serve three-year terms. The vestry meets monthly, on Thursday evenings, and vestry members are also expected to chair or serve on one commission or head up a project for the parish. Convention delegates represent the parish at the two-day diocesan convention, which usually takes place in Hartford in mid-October.

The Nominating Committee, chaired by Charmian Place, is seeking suggestions for people it may nominate to fill all of these positions. These should be active members of St Andrews who attend worship regularly and contribute both time and money to the parish.

The Nominating Committee will consider all suggestions that are submitted, as it forms the slate of candidates for the Annual Meeting. If you'd like to suggest someone—and you may definitely toss your own hat into the ring—please complete a Suggestion Form (available in the Narthex and the parish office; or we can email you one) and give it to Charmian or KC by 20 November. 
