The Second Sunday of Easter

Last week we were all treated to two uplifting Easter services led by Bishop Laura Ahrens whose positive message, smile, and warmth embraced us all. The adult choir, Herman's trumpet, and hand bell choir lifted the hymns, anthems and chants through the roof and out into the heavens above St. Andrew's. And before the final Easter blessing, the children's choir, decked in their Easter best, with our soloist Lyra, gave us all hope for the future of this parish and this country with their energy and voices!

Driving home Maria reminded me of our first Easter service together at St. Andrew's in 1988. Athletic events on Holy Saturday kept the students and faculty close to their respective campuses. It was too far for us to drive on Saturday night to be with family only to return 12 hours later on Easter Day. I asked Maria if she wanted to come to St. Andrew's for the 10:30 am Easter service where I had been attending for about three years by then. I had come to enjoy Maria's company, but we were not yet "an item" back then. As you certainly can envision, the nave was packed with people, some sitting in folding chairs in the aisles with late comers standing in the back! The music soared, people sang joyfully, and the Easter egg hunt after the service was quite the

spectacle! At coffee hour we connected with faculty from Kent, South Kent, and Gunnery (the Frederick Gunn School today), and had animated conversations about school connections, sports teams and dinner plans. We accepted a spontaneous invitation to have Easter dinner at the Milk Pail restaurant, owned by parishioners, which capped off a delightful day.

Maria had been raised in the Roman Catholic Church and found the prayers and format of the Episcopal service very familiar. So the following week, we drove over to St. Andrew's again. This time as we entered the church, Maria looked around and wondered, "Where did everybody go?" No brass, a smaller choir, and the service felt like it was "spring training" rather than a real game! I did explain afterward the concept of "Low Sunday," a phenomenon rather typical for many Protestant parishes. However, that Easter Sunday in 1988 marked the true beginning of our mutual relationship with St. Andrew's, which has endured and strengthened over the last 36 years.

My hope is that each week we can channel that message of the light of Jesus coming into the world after his death and resurrection. That we can spread the message of hope into our communities, and that the words of Bishop Laura will return in our minds to urge us along in our spiritual journeys. Let us encourage all who came last week to return often to our lovely church, and always welcome the visitors that we see in the pews next to us. This is the way that The Word will spread, and that this parish family will grow!


