From Fr Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's,

I hope you are doing well and staying cool.

A few days ago, Jim and I had the great fortune to take the dozens and dozens of sneakers, shoes and socks we all gathered up last spring and deliver them—at last!—to the wonderful folks at Abraham House in the Bronx. They were very grateful, indeed, for our generosity and our caring, and they thanked you all, very much.

This was my first visit to Abraham House, and Althea Brooks, the Executive Director, gave me a wonderful tour and got me more acquainted with all great work they do. Abraham House was founded by a small handful of nuns from Belgium who were working in New York as part of their vocation; some of

them worked as chaplains at Rikers Island. They saw a need to help people who were emerging from long periods of incarceration, and so they opened a small transition program in a single row house on Willis Avenue in the Bronx.

Today, their initial vision has grown and expanded. Abraham House now fills five contiguous row homes—20 floors, in all, of space and mission. They still provides shelter, training and support for people who are leaving prison ... and also, with the agreement of a criminal court judge, as a pre-trial 'diversion' program for others. There is a constant turn-over of residents. Some have been there as little as a few weeks, and one or two as long as two years.

Abraham House's mission, however, has grown far beyond this. Before COVID caused its suspension, they had an active after-school program for children. They have a bustling food pantry that assists hundreds of families in the neighborhood. There is a weekly Mass on Saturday afternoons, followed by a free hot meal. And, through its connection with Catholic Charities, AH assists with dozens of other programs throughout New York. (Althea mentioned that just this week, a call had come in seeking help with more than 500 Venezuelan refugees who had unexpectedly been brought to Catholic Charities' main office in Manhattan.)

Althea spoke warmly (and a little wistfully) about what a blessing Sr Mary Lanning had been for Abraham House. Dropping by often ... bringing bundles of things she'd gathered up in other parts of the city ... and just being with residents and families: a tangible presence of God in their midst.

As I was preparing to leave, Althea mentioned that they always face a need for warm winter coats, usually starting in early December. I told her that St Andrew's might be able to help out with this. Watch this space for details, as they say, but in the meantime, please hold onto any coats you may be thinking of getting rid of!

Take good care, and may God continue to bless the work of the Kingdom you are doing.


Good News I: Susan Guse Now Our Director of Music

The Episcopal Church in Connecticut has been notified that our Bishopelect Jeffrey Mello has received the required majority of consents required in the Church's canonical consent process. In giving consent to Jeff's ordination and consecration, standing committees and bishops exercising jurisdiction in the Episcopal Church attest to knowing of "no impediment on account of which" he ought not to be ordained as bishop, and that his election was conducted in accordance with the canons.

Jeff was elected bishop diocesan at a diocesan convention on May 21. His ordination service is scheduled for October 15.

Memorial Service for Jim Brownell

A Memorial Service celebrating the life and the resurrection of Jim Brownell will be held in the Nave at 11:00 am on Saturday, 13 August. A light reception will follow in the Parish Hall.


