# Special Musical Addition to 11 June 10:30 Morning Prayer Service

This Sunday, June 11, we welcome Marla Rathbun and Rachel Evans, violinists, and Cynthia Peterson, pianist, who will perform J.S. Bach's Double Violin Concerto in D minor during the 10:30 morning prayer service. Thanks to Jon Lafleur for this musical treat and a light lunch for all to follow.

J.S. Bach wrote his Double Violin Concerto, in D minor, in 1730 in Leipzig. It is one of Bach's most famous and admired works. Concert violinists, professional, and amateur players perform it; even student violinists study and play it. Its fast movements, Vivace and Allegro, are lively, energetic and engaging. Both use fugal imitation and abundant counterpoint for the dialogue between the violins. The slow, middle movement fluidly passes its expressive, soulful melody back and forth from one solo voice to the other.


**tuna**. Make certain that the 'Best by ...' dates are not past! Please remember that the Food Bank accepts pet foods as well!




