Just a week ago, Fr Douglas and I drove to Hartford together to the 238 th convention of the Episcopal Church in Connecticut. It was a noteworthy event for several reasons: Bishop Jeffrey Mello presided over the convention, having been consecrated and ordained as our diocesan bishop less than three weeks before; the convention was held in person; there were differences of opinion but no divisive dissension; representatives from parishes throughout the state shared concerns and challenges in interesting and sometimes edifying roundtable discussions; there were moments of bittersweet joy.

Bishop Mello, who recently served as the rector of a church in Massachusetts, set the tone by addressing the parishes of Connecticut directly, promising to listen to the clergy, lay leaders and parishioners talk about our successes, failures, challenges and fears as we get to know him and he us. He spoke of the exhaustion that many of us feel as we struggle, particularly through the past two-and-a-half years, to keep our churches open, welcoming and safe. He urged us to "be who we are and where we are," to be kind to ourselves and others, and to remember that God loves us "abundantly." It was an address filled with promise, good humor and kindness.

Two resolutions passed which merged the parish of St Peter's Church, Monroe,

with the parish Grace Church, Trumbull; and the parish of St John the Evangelist, Yalesville, with the parish of Grace and St Peters, Hamden, respectively. We heard from parishioners from all four churches, who spoke poignantly about the discernment process each parish undertook to work together to make the difficult decision to leave a beloved church to form a new one. Although sadly the reduction in size of each parish brought about these mergers, there was an optimism and joy among all four parishes that these mergers would provide a new opportunity to "reflect God's love to our communities" and further God's mission in the world.

It was uplifting for me to be present in a wonderfully diverse, large and joyful group, united in our common faith as practicing Episcopalians.

Community Thanksgiving Service: Tuesday, 22 November



St Andrew's Wants *You*: From the Nominating Committee






