

St. Andrew's received an impressive honor last week from The American Institute of Architects, Connecticut chapter. Unknown to us, each year the Connecticut chapter celebrates architectural treasures in each of the State's eight counties. It's a competition (of sorts) that celebrates CT's rich architectural heritage. The program focuses on a different building type each year, and this year, the program is focusing on churches. St. Andrew's Episcopal Church has been nominated for Litchfield County.

The purpose of the program is to expand the general public's awareness of architecture and its impact on culture, community, and the built environment. Each county's nomination will be featured on the AIACT website. The public is invited to vote for their favorite "Connecticut Treasure." We will have more on that process in next week's Epistle. The voting takes place online July 24th-28th

The parish has always treasured our church building, and over the years we have taken our responsibility as stewards faithfully for future generations of parishioners, but it's quite another thing for a preeminent organization like the AIA to recognize such excellence. Architectural firms all over the country submit their buildings to local, state and national chapters for recognition and awards, but since our architect is deceased, it's even more special to have the AIA nominate us for a possible award.

More to come on how to vote and we need to spread the word to local organizations like the Chamber of Commerce, Town Hall, The Historical Society and the community at large. This is an honor not only for St. Andrew's but also for Kent and Litchfield County.






