St Andrew's Current COVID Status

PARISH IS NOW OPEN. The parish is now open for in-person worship. At its meeting on 21 March, the vestry voted, with the recommendation of the priest-in-charge and the wardens, to re-open the parish for worship. This is a permanent decision, unless the pandemic takes another dire turn. Social distancing will be required. Therefore, attendance at all services will be limited to 30 people. (Those who reside in the same household count as one person ... but we will nevertheless be prudent about the total number of people in the nave.) Masks must be worn, and the nave windows will be opened to increase air circulation. There will be no congregational singing or distribution of communion at this time.

If you wish to attend worship in-person, you *must* contact Irene Connors (860-592-0030 or collageconnors@gmail.com). Irene will be compiling a list for each service, to ensure we do not exceed our capacity limits.

We will continue to livestream all of our services, as well, as there are many parishioners who are choosing not to be in group settings at this time—a decision the parish fully honors and supports.

From Father Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

I hope you are having a blessed Eastertide. (The season of Easter continues through the Day of Pentecost, which falls on 23 May, this year.)

Every day since I traveled to Israel a year-and-a-half ago, I have prayed for the peace of Jerusalem: both for literal peace in a city and country that seems

perpetually engulfed in conflict of so many different origins; and, more metaphorically (Jerusalem being a symbol of God's reign), for the peace of God to take hold of this entire world and make it a place of universal justice, dignity and well-being for all God's creatures. The realization of God's peace on earth has eluded humanity as long as we have known God. Countless obstacles of our own creation stand in its way: inequalities of wealth, resources and power; deep-seated, generationally bequeathed prejudices and hatreds; and humanity's biologically driven aversion to change since it often brings loss—or, at least, the initial *appearance* of loss.

But for the last seven or so years, a peace, of sorts ... tenuous and tense ... has prevailed in Israel. Well, perhaps not so much peace, but at least the absence-of-conflict that can serve as a pathway to peace for those who wish to pursue it. Tragically, bloody conflict and violent death have now taken hold once again in Jerusalem, Gaza and other places in the Holy Land. This column is not the place to explore its deep-rooted origins or its potential resolution. That calls for wide, thoughtful discussion. But I do ask all of us to pray for the peace of Jerusalem: that the violence and killing end ... that each faction be willing to speak with all others, in candor and good faith ... that all parties, as well as international partners trying to help, come to embrace the mutuality and *agapē* love that genuine peace demands ... and that God Almighty bless the peacemakers and also turn the hearts of those bent upon hatred and injustice.

Take good care, and may God continue to bless the work of the Kingdom you are doing.




