

From Father Douglas

Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

I hope you are doing well and having a meaningful Holy Week, in anticipation of our most joyful celebration of Christ's Rising from the dead.

As I was driving to the cathedral in Hartford earlier this week for the annual renewal of ordination vows, I heard a piece on NPR—perhaps some of you heard it, too—about older residents of Kyiv who cannot leave their apartments despite the ongoing atrocities. As the host introduced this audio essay, I prepared myself for a grim, gut-wrenching account of sorrow and despair. Instead, what followed was a beautiful portrait of life—ongoing life—in three apartments in one building in a decimated city. First was a couple, both 87 years old, who were just happy to be together. Next was a 90-year-old bedridden woman being cared for by her son. "Even though my life isn't great," she said, "I don't want to die." And last, a spry woman in her 80s who was making a batch of her renown sauerkraut and watching her great-granddaughter, busy making up songs at a toy piano.

Sitting in the middle of Holy Week, I came to reflect on how well this report about vulnerable civilians in an war zone that none of us could have imagined just a few months ago offered a rich image of our Christian faith: We know it and live it in a contentious, difficult and often broken world ... and yet, in Christ —and in Christ *Risen*, especially—there is always hope: the hope to carry on

... the hope of renewal ... the hope of new life, both here and in the world that is to come. He is Risen, indeed! He is *always* Risen. And "Alleluia" will always be the last word!

I invite you to conclude your Holy Week journey with ustonight at 7:30, for the spare, moving Liturgy of Good Friday, and tomorrow morning at 11:00, for the brief Liturgy of Holy Saturday. And then I encourage you to attend—to try on!—the dramatic and climactic Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday evening at 7:30, as well as our traditional Easter Morning Eucharists at both 8:30 and 10:30. After the 10:30 Eucharist, please plan to stay for anextra special Coffee Hour, and let anyone you know who has children that our annual Easter Egg Hunt will be held then, too. (Families are welcome to come dye eggs and share in a pizza feast at 11:00 am on Saturday, in the Parish House.)

This weekend we mount the very summit of our faith and proclaim for all the world to hear the good Good News of Christ: He has slain evil and death, and we shall not die, but live! Please come help us make a most joyful noise, so all the world may know, again, the Hope of the Resurrection.

Take good care, and may God continue to bless the work of the Kingdom you are doing.



During Eastertide: Evening Prayer and Benediction



Each Sunday during Eastertide this year, we will be praying Evening Prayer at 4:30. Some think of this office as the quintessential Anglican liturgy: quiet in tone, relaxed in pace and reflective. On 15 May, we will hold the office of Evensong—sung Evening Prayer—led by the visiting ensemble Saecula Schola Cantorum.

Following Evening Prayer, we will offer the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, for those who wish to stay. This is a brief but powerful liturgy in which we reverence and contemplate the Presence of Christ ... the Risen Christ ... in the consecrated Bread. We'll use a bit of incense during Benediction, but not during Evening Prayer.

We invite you to try on these liturgies ... and the practice of concluding your

Lord's Day in some quiet, joyful worship ... during the season of Easter.

Sunday, 01 May: The Sherman Chamber Ensemble Returns



The Sherman Chamber Ensemble's "Best of Baroque" concerts have been praised as "stunning performances ... inspiring and uplifting." This year promises the same. Usually held in early January to herald in the New Year, this year's Baroque concerts were postponed to the spring out of caution due to the COVID pandemic.

Audiences will be treated to works by masters of the Baroque era played by the best of today's chamber music artists. The concert is in memory of the Ensemble's long-time friend and performer, harpsichordist Ken Cooper, and is dedicated to Bill McGoldrick, remembered for his commitment to the Ensemble.

The program will include music for piano, flute and strings by Corelli, Handel, Vivaldi. It concludes with one of the most beloved works of the Baroque repertoire – Bach's *Brandenburg Concerto No. 5, BWV 105Q* said by some to have secured his place among the greatest composers of the Baroque era.

Joining the Ensemble for the first time is Yamaha Artist and pianist Evan

Shinners, a graduate of the Juilliard School and now a mentor at the institution. Since 2010, he has devoted himself almost exclusively to the study and performance of the works of J S Bach.

The Ensemble will present this concert on Sunday, 01 May, at 4:00 pm, here at St Andrew's. General Admission tickets are \$25, and children ages 15 and under are admitted free. Tickets may be purchased online at www.SCEmusic.org or at the door. For information or reservations call 860-355-5930 or email info@SCEmusic.org.

We've also given them a tour of their house and showed them the house mechanicals and appliances. They're sure to have more questions down the road.

It was so moving to finally go over to meet them. It's a very good thing we have undertaken. Thank you all so much for your help and support.
