

St Andrew's Current COVID Closure Status

(Please see Fr Douglas' column, below, for a fuller explanation of this update.)

Parish Closed. As of Thursday, 20 November, either the Town of Kent and/or a majority of the surrounding towns is in red status on the Connecticut COVID Data Tracker. Therefore all worship services will be pre-recorded and made available on our YouTube account at least an hour before they were scheduled to occur. In addition, all other parish activities will either be suspended or move to online-only; participants in those activities will be updated separately. The parish will remain in closed status until both Kent and a majority of the surrounding towns are less-than-red for two successive Thursdays.[pw1]

From Father Douglas



Dear People of St Andrew's Parish,

Every morning, as part of Morning Prayer, I pray for the world as it confronts the COVID-19 pandemic. I pray the same seven intercessions each day, and two of them seem quite relevant to what I have to share with you this week. First, I pray for all human beings as we make decisions about how to keep one another ... and ourselves ... safe during these unsafe times. Second, I pray for all those in authority: that they may make dispassionate decisions and take sound actions regarding our response to this virus.

These two prayers, in particular, have been on my mind a lot this week. The recent upsurge of COVID-19 in Connecticut and just about everywhere else means that we need to think about additional measures to keep parishioners and others safe. Although gathering for worship on Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings and other times is a deeply engrained practice for many of us, following Jesus' commandment to love our neighbors means that we may have to forgo, for a time, some of the things we most cherish, to help limit the spread of the virus.

To this end, at the November vestry meeting, St Andrew's adopted the following COVID closure protocol: Each Thursday afternoon, we will look at the Connecticut COVID Data Tracker (https://portal.ct.gov/Coronavirus/COVID-19-Data-Tracker). If either the Town of Kent and/or a majority of the towns around Kent are red, meaning they have 15 or more cases per 100,000 people, then:

All worship will be pre-recorded and online-only (The choir will not rehearse or sing; a single cantor may sing during pre-recorded worship.) Recordings of Sunday services will be uploaded to the parish's YouTube account by 8:00 am on Sunday morning, and recordings of other services (including Sunday evening services during Advent) will be uploaded at least an hour before they were scheduled to take place. Bulletins for Sunday worship will be available online, as usual.

• All other in-person activities at the parish willeither be suspended *or* move to online-only.

If we move to online-only, we will announce this in the Friday and Saturday Epistles *and* on the parish web site. Any move to online-only will continue until the COVID status of Kent and/or the surrounding towns has moved to orange (or less) for *two successive Thursdays*.

It was difficult to make this decision, and it may be a difficult one to accept. Ultimately, the most important consideration is that we all remain safe and healthy so that we can return to worship and fellowship as an entire parish, once the pandemic has ended.

Sunday Evening Worship During Advent

Hard to believe though it may be, Advent begins on Sunday, 29 November. During Advent this year we will offer an additional time of worship on Sunday evenings at 5:00: Evening Prayer (without preaching), followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. If you have not experienced it, Benediction is "a short service of hymns and prayers offered while the Sacrament [*i.e.*, the already consecrated Host] is placed on the altar" (*St Augustine's Prayer Book*, 194). The heart of the service is partaking, in silence, in the "the unending blessing flowing from God through the grace of the sacraments." The service ends with the Sacrament being placed back in the tabernacle to the accompaniment of a psalm or hymn. (We will record these liturgies and post them to the parish's YouTube account.)

The venerable tradition of Benediction does not 'speak' to everyone, and if

you'd prefer to attend only Evening Prayer, there will an opportunity to exit before Benediction begins. But during these times when we cannot receive communion sacramentally, perhaps you may wish to 'try on' another experience of sacramental grace during Advent... as we prepare for the inbreaking of Christ into this world.

Computer Help is Available




