"...Faith, hope and love abide. And the greatest of these is love." Love never dies.

We heard this message from First Corinthians just a few weeks ago. It has always been one of my favorites. It was read by a close friend at our wedding, thirty years ago this October, in St Andrew's. We taped the service and I listened to the tape last Sunday. It was particularly poignant to hear Florence read it and I reflected on how little her voice had changed over the years. The same low pitch, melodic and sweet. That morning I received word from her son that Florence had died.

I wrote about her several weeks ago. A precious friend of forty years, who had kept cancer at bay for twenty-five years and confirmed in January that she had about six months left. She lived those six months the way she lived her previous years: blessing every day she had.

Her daughter, Sarah, married last year and was living in France. She and her husband bought a vineyard and were starting the slow climb to (hopefully) "recommended by Kermit Lynch." I'd seen the pictures: bucolic in the extreme and also heard about the intense labor involved. Florence had not yet been there and she wanted to go. She left the last week in May. I got a text with a

photo and was so happy to see the joy on both their faces. Their love for each other was so apparent.

Cancer always gets you in the end, and it claimed Florence two days before she was to go home. I believe in my heart that when she left JFK, she knew she would not return.

As much as I, and everyone else (especially Florence), was expecting this, it was still a shock. I went to the 8:30 service and heard Randy preach a beautiful homily about the trials of Elijah and one line stuck with me: "You're not as important as you think you are in this world." That made me think of my friend. She never took herself seriously. The world, yes. Her cancer, most certainly. But not herself. She loved life.

I feel so blessed to have known her for forty years, and to have been a part of her life. I thank God she was a part of mine.

Love never dies.

So, what is the take-away from this?

Savor what we have. Now. Be kind. Now. Love. Now. And never take love for granted. Please be kind.

Florence, I will miss you dearly. Thank you for everything.




